
## RENTAL INFORMATION

The Renton History Museum offers a Classroom Curriculum targeting 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students. The curriculum explores the material culture, social life, values, and beliefs of the Coast Salish (Duwamish) Native Americans before the arrival of settlers of European descent.

The Curriculum consists of five lesson plans that fulfill Essential Academic Learning Requirements (EALRs) and Classroom Based Assessments (CBAs) in accordance with Washington State standards.



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## INTRODUCTION

Developed in consultation with First Nations peoples, the Classroom Curriculum is a portable kit that consists of lesson plans, Coast Salish replica objects, activities, worksheets, and audiovisual materials.

The Washington State Social Studies Classroom Based Assessments (CBAs) fulfilled by lessons in this kit are "Humans and the Environment," "Dig Deep," "Cultural Contributions," and "Meeting Needs and Wants." The kit also satisfies Grade Level Expectations (GLEs) in Visual Arts.

## UNIT I: COAST SALISH/DUWAMISH MATERIAL LIFE (ANALYSIS OF OBJECTS)

Students learn about Duwamish/Coast Salish culture from objects. By closely examining replicas of Duwamish cultural artifacts, students gain the skills to analyze and critically observe and discuss significant aspects of Duwamish and Coast Salish Culture.

## UNIT II: FINDING CULTURE (STUDENT PRESENTATIONS)

In this unit, students learn how to organize the information that they discovered from the replicas in the cultural education kit and present it to classmates.

## UNIT III: COAST SALISH CULTURE (POWERPOINT PRESENTATION)

Students review and widen their knowledge by participating in a PowerPoint presentation about the material, social, and spiritual life of the Coast Salish tribes/Duwamish People.



## UNIT IV: DESIGN YOUR COAST SALISH ART (HANDS-ON ACTIVITIES)


In this lesson, students learn the important symbols and elements of Coast Salish art by making brown paper versions of Coast Salish hats, vests, necklaces, canoes, mats, and longhouses.

## UNIT V: LEARNING FROM COAST SALISH MYTHS (STORYTELLING)

Students learn and discuss the meaning of Coast Salish stories and create a piece of art demonstrating what they learned. Teachers also have the opportunity to book a Native American storyteller to visit their classroom (at least 1 month notice required).
